

More than half of schools use their sunshine coach once or more a day. That's hugely significant, when we think about the sunshine coach's 15-20 year lifespan.



Long Term Impact

Life-changing support UK-wide



St. James's Place Charitable Foundation's donations of £1.4m have supported almost 52,000 children. That's an average of just 50p, per child, to provide access to a Coach trip, on any given day.

A sunshine coach equips the school community with the means and motivation to seek out new activities. Sunshine coaches provide a positive and lasting difference to disabled children in underserved communities. St. James's Place's support literally gives the momentum needed to ensure children enjoy unforgettable experiences.

Earlier in the year, we invited schools to tell us about the difference their sunshine coach made. Most schools replied. We were overwhelmed with the fantastic feedback across the UK.





A real, immediate difference

- Educational learning experiences: Educational (work experience, museums) and Cultural activities (art workshops, galleries)
- Cultural and wellbeing activities: Environmental (trips to local parks, gardens, workshops) and recreational trips (theme parks, parties, picnics, trips to theatre)
- Recreation and respite: Sports and games (adventure activities) and Fun activities (visits to the farm, trips to the Beach

96% of all schools told us that St. James' Place Charitable Foundation's Sunshine Coach enabled their children to access all of these activities. That's a real, tangible difference.


Our journey with St. James's Place Charitable Foundation

We started our journey with St. James's Place Charitable Foundation over 20 years ago.

In 2002, St. James's Place Charitable Foundation donated their very first Sunshine Coach to St Christopher's School in Lincoln.

Since then, our partnership has reached every corner of the UK. As a result, we have been able to target our support where its most urgently needed. Today, we are proud to have supported 51,808 children (and counting!).


Empowering young lives everyday



Northern England

Supporting journeys across 14 communities



Over the last 20 years, St. James's Place Charitable Foundation has directly supported 15,850 children across Northern England.

Since their first donation of a Sunshine Coach to Elms Bank Specialist Arts College back in 2002, St. James's Place has directed their support across over 14 communities. This has unlocked an estimated 56,035 trips and days out.

4 in 10 communities supported by St. James's Place are ranked in the top fifth most disadvantaged areas (per the Index of Multiple Deprivation).

St. James's Place Charitable Foundation has supported schools across:

- Liverpool: Barlows Primary School and Princes Primary
- Harrogate: Nidderdale Resource Centre, Hadrian School
- Manchester: Elms Bank Specialist Arts College and Oakwood Academy
- Newcastle: Cramlington, Sir Charles Parsons School

The Foundation have also supported 7 more schools across Wakefield, Bolton, Northumberland, Salford, Cheshire and more.

Hadrian School

The Hadrian School, based in Newcastle Upon-Tyne, caters to the needs of 170 children aged between 2-11 years old, diagnosed with severe & complex learning disabilities.



Midlands and East Anglia

Supporting journeys across 10 communities



Over the last 20 years, St. James's Place Charitable Foundation has directly supported 8,541 children in the Midlands and East Anglia with 37,194 trips out. The first Sunshine Coach here was St Christopher's School in Lincoln back in 2002.

1 in 3 of communities supported by St. James's Place here are ranked in the top-fifth most disadvantaged in the UK (per the Index of Multiple Deprivation). This includes:

- Birmingham and Warwickshire: Cromwell Learning Community MAT, Springfield House School
- Nottinghamshire: Foxwood School, Portland College and Carlton Digby Day School
- Middlesex: Grangewood School, Resources for Autism and Manor Mead School

Plus a further array of schools, such as Thomas Wolsey School in Suffolk, Marjorie McClure School in Kent, St Christopher's School in Lincoln and Walton Leigh School in Surrey.





Access to the Sunshine Coach has added enormous value to the provision that we offer and provide a wealth of opportunities to access off site activities that they might not ordinarily have access to.

By supporting educational and curriculum learning, this has enabled our pupils to develop their independence, social and emotional skills, resilience and physical skills. Importantly, offsite trips and visits also provide enjoyment, fun and a wealth of creative opportunities!





Portland Charity

Portland College is a college for people with a wide range of disabilities. Their includes Further Education, Employment Support and Personal Care for 281 children and young people up to the age of 19.

We are able to provide educational trips and accessible transport for work experience and Supported Internships. We provide access to enrichment opportunities and cultural visits, as well as medical visits to the GP and hospital."





Supporting the local community in Nottingham

"Being able to support local schools, community groups and other charities to access our fully inclusive facilities is really important in our mission to provide a lifetime of opportunity for all.

We are able to support local schools, community groups and other charities to access our state-of-the-art, fully inclusive facilities. Finally, we recruit volunteer Coach drivers. This provides these individuals (usually elderly) the opportunity to gain a sense of purpose, remain active and ensure they do not become isolated. [The Coach] provides Duke of Edinburgh Award accessibility. Portland deliver the bronze and silver awards; providing fully inclusive opportunities to people living with a disability. We couldn't do this without the Sunshine Coach. Without the transport, we couldn't deliver the awards, due to the lack of community transport available and the cost that would be incurred."



Cromwell Learning Community Trust



Cromwell Learning Community Multi Academy Trust works in an area of high deprivation in Birmingham. They support 656 children aged 3-11 and there over a third of pupils receive a free school meal.

Update from Cromwell Learning Trust: Five years on!

"[The Sunshine Coach] has opened both opportunities and possibilities for our children to venture out of their immediate environment.

Indeed some of our children when in the countryside on our coach "asked are we still in England?"

We are enabled by the coach to give experiences that the children otherwise might not have. Children's comments from moving from urban to rural areas are shaping their stories of what life was like in their own country e.g. Sudan, Somalia, Iran, Iraq, Syria. Indeed when the parents come into join in the school activities, they comment on their experiences of coming from back home when they are exposed to the environment. This is an exciting addition to school resources which will open many doors regarding access to experiences in our local and national environment."



Foxwood Academy

Foxwood Academy is a special needs school for over 110 students aged 3-19. They cater for children & young people with moderate & severe learning difficulties.

In April 2022, Leckie Presley, partner of St. James Place, was delighted to meet with the students and enjoyed hearing the impact of the coach directly and the ways it will open up opportunities for them.

By improving social mobility, the Sunshine Coach opens doors to new environments and experiences, fostering a sense of autonomy and confidence in our students. The addition of a Sunshine Coach to our special school has had a transformative impact on our students.

This essential resource significantly enhances their independence, offering opportunities for real-world learning and experience that are critical in preparing them for adulthood. It helps to build peer relationships, providing a platform for social interaction and bonding that is crucial for emotional and social development.



Last December, our special school had the wonderful opportunity to take a group of children carol singing in the center of Nottingham. This outing was a powerful demonstration of what our students can achieve with the right support. This event was a milestone for our school, raising almost £1000!

It was heart-warming to see the community come together to support our cause, and it provided a platform for our students to shine. Parents were thrilled to watch their children perform, many for the first time in such a public setting. The joy and pride on their faces were unforgettable. This outing was a testament to how we can empower our children to achieve great things and be active, visible members of our community.

Southern England

Supporting journeys across 21 communities



St. James's Place Charitable Foundation has supported 17,542 children in Southern England. In turn, this has unlocked 71,682 trips out.

Southern England

Their first Coach was to Columbus School in London in 2003. Over half of supported schools are in the most disadvantaged areas. A quarter of schools are in the 80-90% most deprived.

1 in 4 communities supported by St. James's Place in Southern England are ranked in the top-fifth most financially disadvantaged. In London, this comprises:

- Inner London: Greenwich Toy Library in Greenwich, Valence School in Seven Oaks and Brook Special Community School in Haringey
- Greater London: Oak View School in Epping Forest, Livingstone Primary School in Barnet and Columbus School in Bexley.





All of our outings were absolutely amazing and benefited all our children and young people. Our trips to the seaside were always a hit with the children, many had never seen the sea and sand before. To be able to see a smile on their faces was priceless Our Sunshine Coach was a lifeline and opened a whole new world of opportunities for us.

Livingstone Primary and Nursery School



Livingstone Primary and Nursey School is a small and friendly one-form entry school in New Barnet, set in extensive grounds with spacious classrooms and excellent outdoor facilities. It supports around 250 pupils.

"Our Sunshine coach has expanded the number of activities that we can attend and one outstanding event was the Bowling Competition organised by the Barnet Sports Partnership. This was one many sporting events now attended by our SEND pupils and it was an event that we managed to win. I have included a photo of the event and you can see from the faces of the pupils how the success in this event has impacted on the them!

We use the Sunshine coach to enable us to deliver the curriculum to our SEND pupils. Having a Sunshine Coach has been key to providing a rich and varied curriculum for our pupils. If the pupils cannot access learning on a particular topic effectively in the classroom, an educational visit using the Sunshine Coach, can provide an immersive experience to compensate for this.

This has impacted on their educational and emotional outcomes. We have offered them so many different experiences and this has helped them grow in confidence, overcome barriers to learning and achieve to the best of their ability.

For example we've used the Coach to take pupils to high points in London to experience the views when working on the topic of hills and mountains. We've also taken pupils on tours of landmarks when working on maps."



Grangewood School

Grangewood School is a primary school for up to 140 children aged 3-11 with severe learning difficulties and physical and complex needs, including ASD. **Grangewood School pupils** attend school at one of three specialist locations.

The Sunshine Coach has opened a new world for our children to explore.

"Some of our children are in wheelchairs and their families do not have their own transport and public transport is not suitable for them so for them to be able to explore new environments with their friends has been incredible.

We are a school for children with severe special needs so getting out in the community is such an important part of our children's development...a lot of our children are unable to access activities

Granaewood School

Most of our children love swimming so we take them to the local swimming pool. It is also used in holiday clubs so the children can visit farms, zoo's and specialist play centres. Other pupils are unable to go into the community with their families so we it is such a vital resource for their independence and life skills to be able to visit shops, garden centres, activity centres and much more."

South East England

Supporting journeys across 6 communities



Since their first donation of a Sunshine Coach to the Jigsaw Trust in 2005, St. James's Place has supported 6 communities. In turn, this has unlocked 23,299 trips out for disabled and disadvantaged children.

Two-thirds of schools we've targeted are in the most financially disadvantaged areas of the country.

Despite the relative affluence of South East.

St. James's Place Charitable Foundation has funded schools in:

- Middlesex, Essex and Surrey: Resources for Autism, Childs Hill School, Jigsaw Trust
- Berkshire and Hampshire: Fitzwaryn School and Cliffdale Primary Academy
- Kent: Marjorie McClure Specialist School

Jigsaw Trust is a charity inspired by autism in its desire to provide the very best in ongoing education,vocational and wellbeing services for autistic individuals as well as the best support for their families

Location: Waverley, Surrey

Donation: 14 seater **Year of support:** 2005



Having a Sunshine Coach has given our children living with autism access to a variety of activities and opportunities that are not available at school. Our children have been able to enjoy many off-site activities ranging from horseriding, swimming, gymnastics and many more.

The amazing donation of our Sunshine Coach has enabled us to recently take our learners on their annual residential holiday. We also often use the Sunshine Coach for our trips where the pupils take part in horse riding on a weekly basis. We are working towards their certification at the end of term.

"The Sunshine Coach has opened the world to our children. As a school supporting children with complex special needs, the ability to easily access transport has allowed us to provide our children with experiences that would otherwise have been impossible.

"For the last few years, I have taught a class of 6-8 complex needs learners with behaviours associated with autism and trauma.

My pupils display a high level of anxiety, behaviours and historically struggled to access the community. Additionally, some pupils have limited opportunities to explore environments beyond home and school due to socio-economic pressure. Having our own Sunshine Coach in school has offered the class autonomy, flexibility and, ultimately, opportunity.

We have had the chance to generalise skills learnt in school into wider contexts. We have supported pupils to access a range of opportunities. Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland

Supporting journeys across 10 communities



St. James's Place Foundation has directly supported 9,876 children across these three nations.

St. James's Place Charitable Foundation has supported 6 communities in Scotland, 2 in Wales and 2 in Northern Ireland. In turn, this has unlocked 28,677 trips out!

6 in 10 for schools are in the top 20% most financially disadvantaged areas. Half of these are in the top 10%.

St. James's Place has supported schools in:

- Scotland: Stirling, Perth, Dunbarton, Kincardine and Lanarkshire.
- Wales: Monmouth and Glamorgan
- Northern Ireland: Antrim and Coleraine



There is rarely a day that our sunshine coach is not loaded with pupils and out on an adventure. The Coach allows our students to explore the world beyond the school walls. Each trip is a mini-adventure, reinforcing their self-esteem and teaching valuable life skills.

Every time the Coach is used it enables a group of pupils with special educational needs to learn, experience new things and make memories that stay with our pupils, long after the Coach is parked up.

Our sunshine coach is an essential tool in the education of our children and young people. We are a special needs school, trips and visits are a vital part of our curriculum. The skills and qualifications these pupils have obtained have been amazing. Without our Coach this wouldn't be possible.





Maes Ebbw Special School

Maes Ebbw supports over 140 children and young people from 3-19 years with a range of complex special educational needs who require specialist provision to achieve their potential as they move into adulthood.


The Sunshine Coach offers all of our pupils access to their community, and enables them to take part in equitable experiences as their peers would, for example, taking part in pupil forums, workstreams and events through which they share their voice and vision.

One of our pupils was about to undergo surgery, his wish for his last week in school before his operation was to visit Folly Farm. The Sunshine coach made it possible for his whole class to go with him on the visit, as many of his class peers used wheelchairs and adapted buggies, meaning everyday coaches or buses would not have been able to transport them.





Woodland View / Merkland School



Woodland View School is a purpose built specialist school planned and designed to meet learners' social, emotional, learning and medical needs. They provide early years, primary department & secondary education to over 200 pupils.

We have been able to undertake so many opportunities that we could not have otherwise accessed. These have included learning and social opportunities. We've used the coach in developing real areas of skill development for our learners. Sometimes it is months of planning for a half hour trip. We are incredibly grateful for having the flexibility to do long and short-term planning.

We have been able to take our young people to an Additional Special Needs football tournament, [to become] part of a wider ASN network in other schools. By going on our own we were able to ensure all young people were able to go, their dignity was preserved and we could move / leave / travel at our own pace.
