Variety, the Children's Charity, ended 2024 with an incredible breadth of impact.

In the last six months, we've reached recordlevels of children and young people, with an accolade of enormously successful, Variety-led national awards, as well as in the North West.

We've put an incredible 87 Sunshine Coaches on the road this year (more than twice last) and donated 130 specialist pieces of equipment and wheelchairs to disabled and disadvantaged children.

Whether it be launching our televised Variety Disability Sports Awards and national 'Voices for Change' access to sports for disabled children campaign, to raising breaking recordbreaking amounts at our Property Industry Awards, in not one but three major cities nationwide.

We couldn't be prouder, nor expect a more fantastic way to celebrate our 75th anniversary.

As Variety's new Chief Executive Officer, I have hit the ground running, with an ambitious strategy for growth to reach even more vulnerable children across the U.K at a time when the challenges faced by disabled & disadvantaged children are greater than ever.

In the last 6 months, we've published our first Theory of Change, coupled with our 'Impact Ecosystem' model. This strategic framework equips Variety to build on and scale up a coordinated, impactful expansion across the UK.

We are now excellently equipped to drive forward our impact for children. With His Majesty King Charles III, generously choosing patronage of our charity earlier this year, this honour truly testifies to Variety's respected role as a vital charitable institution in the U.K.

We are proud to be able to offer support to so many children and young people across the UK. As a vital supporter, we hope you are too. Thank you for helping us to achieve our mission.

Opening Remarks

An update from Variety, the Children's Charity

This year at Variety, we celebrate our 75th anniversary in Great Britain.

That's 75 years of providing practical help and making an immediate difference to disabled and disadvantaged children and young people.

Every child deserves a chance to live their best life and reach their full potential. Yet today, the cost of raising a disabled child is three times that of raising a non-disabled child.

The cost of living crisis is affecting countless parents like Lucy, who only wish to meet their child's needs:



Variety gave me this wheelchair. It's light which means I'm keeping more energy [...] I like it because, when I'm older, I'll have to do more independent things on my own.

As I get to do more and more things by myself, it's a step that feels really good to accomplish.

When I'm older I want to be an engineer, to make things that I'm not able to do accessible: so that other people can do them.

<u>Please watch and learn about</u> <u>George's story, here.</u>



It was the most horrific diagnosis I could have imagined for George. Not being able to walk. The ability to breathe independently, cough, swallow...

When he was using [his] NHS Chair, his muscles actually declined. Because it was simply too heavy.

My son's gone through so much. He's going to lose his shoulder strength just because I can't get him the [wheelchair] he needs.

The pressure is immense.

Variety's life changing services





This year, Variety's life-changing services have grown at a pace that we started at, with an exceptional level of demand.

We've received a significant growth in requests for support from children and families, schools, and organisations. To put this into context, we've experienced an almost 50% increase in requests from both families and for our Sunshine Coaches.

Our team is now also handling a growing number of urgent calls for support for specialist equipment and wheelchairs. With a dedicated team, mentioned earlier this year, now settled and in place, we are well positioned to build more effective services that are fit for the future and meet the evolving needs of families.

2024 has truly exceeded our expectations, on so many levels.

We started the year with our ambitious goal of putting 62 Sunshine Coaches on the road to celebrate the 62nd year of the service. We've far exceeded this, with 87 Sunshine Coaches delivered thus far. We are therefore well equipped to transform the pace and scale of engagement with schools nationally.

With two dedicated personnel within our service, we are now excellently positioned to resource future growth.

We are proud to be thriving, as more and more charities in the UK pause and cancel their services. Variety is playing an increasingly pivotal role in reaching the most disadvantaged communities in the UK.






Sunshine Coaches

Getting the show on the road!

This year, our flagship Sunshine Coach Programme has expanded throughout the UK.

Our team has put an amazing 87 Sunshine Coaches on the road so far, with a further 50 bought to be built and delivered next year. With even more planned and on the way!

In the last six months, we've put an amazing 36 more Coaches on the road. That's an amazing £2.4m secured from our sponsors and schools.

Looking ahead

Next year, we're aiming to strengthen more Sunshine Coaches on the road! Variety is in a great position to sustain such high levels of delivery for next year.

50% more schools have requested support than last year. This shows no signs of abating and clearly evidences the growing importance of Variety in promoting community transport for children and young people nationally.

Surges in requests are strongest in London and the South East at £2.28m (2023: £700,000), the Midlands at £867,244 (2023: £200,000) and Wales at £170,315 (2023: £25,000).

2024 has proven a vital juncture for the service. We've not received (and delivered on) this extent of demand in almost 15 years.

Variety is now a critical supplier of opportunities for schools across the UK. Promisingly, we have successfully negotiated a further batch of 50 coaches, 'frozen' at existing prices. With further orders planned.

We are especially looking to support more schools, as we retain a competitive service and at prices that are rarely matched on such a scale. All at a time when many organisations are cancelling or pausing services.

Surpassing milestones with our supporters

This year, Variety proudly celebrated our handover of an amazing 87 Sunshine Coaches. It's a feat not achieved in well-over a decade, whilst reaching an amazing accolade of milestones with our partners.

Variety's first-ever electric Sunshine Coach with DPD

In a ground-breaking move, express parcel delivery firm DPD has donated the first-ever electric Variety Sunshine Coach to Rotherhithe Primary School, marking a historic milestone in the 30-year partnership

Presented in December, the new electric coach represents a significant step towards sustainability in the charity's fleet of vehicles.

The fully electric vehicle will not only reduce carbon emissions but will also provide reliable and comfortable transport for children to access the vital opportunities and experiences they need to support their learning and growth.





We are delighted to receive the first allelectric Variety Sunshine Coach... providing our students enrichment opportunities vital to their growth and learning. For our learners it is an example of innovation which supports environmental responsibility, cares for our planet, and provides opportunities beyond the local environment.

Variety's 50th Sunshine Coach for St. James's Place Charitable Foundation

In September, we were delighted to celebrate our historic landmark, when the Foundation pledged their 50th Sunshine Coach to Westcroft School in Wolverhampton.

Our national report serves as a storybook for the schools we've supported together over 20 years. It demonstrates the tried, tested and uniquely trusted, special relationship we hold with schools nationwide. It further evidences Variety's ongoing commitment towards evidencing impact and showcasing how we're driving forward change.





Specialist equipment and wheelchairs

Supporting disabled and disadvantaged children across the UK

So far this year, Variety has directly supported 130 families through grants to individuals.

In the last 6 months, we've delivered 24 more wheelchairs, as well as 40 specialist pieces of equipment to disabled and disadvantaged children.

That's an amazing feat of £220,160! With over £400,675 donated this year so far.



Izzy was born with, what was then called diplegia cerebral palsy.

We were told when she was 22 months old that she may never walk, talk or do anything, and that it would be down to us and her [Izzy's] determination.

Variety came into our lives, many years ago, firstly when Isabelle she was really guite small. She was about 4 years old. She needed a powered wheelchair for school and now, this year, she's got a brand-new manual chair.

It just changes somebody's life. For us Variety are an amazing charity.

Judo is where my life really flourishes.

It's a place that I can go and be the same as everybody else. Without anybody asking me why I'm in a wheelchair! I just feel really confident when I'm on the mat and just feel no different to everybody else

Without [Variety's] funding I wouldn't be able to have the wheelchairs that I've got now. I wouldn't be able to move about, be as independent and keep up with my friends.

Any wheelchair, that isn't the wheelchair I'm in now, [cannot] meet all my needs and they're tiring... whereas the wheelchair I'm in currently is bespoke. So it meets every single one of my needs.

Without Variety I wouldn't have as much Independence.





Opening Remarks

Stories from families

This year, we provided a specialist bed for Ohad, aged 10, from Birmingham, to help his family manage his epilepsy.

Ohad requires full assistance for everything. He has sleep issues, despite medication, and experiences frequent seizures. Communication is limited to tone, eye contact and touch as he is non-verbal.

His sleep issues persist, leading to frequent awakenings throughout the night. He relies entirely on assistance for his hygiene, wears incontinence pads requiring regular changes, and remains immobile, relying on a fixed wheelchair.

Given the frequency of seizures, continuous close proximity and monitoring are crucial. His limited response to conventional methods mean interaction primarily relies on tone, eye contact and touch, severely limiting communication.



Sam has had multiple hospital visits in the last few months for different types of surgeries. At the moment, he is recovering from a hernia.

Sam would be comfortable and the cot would give him room to play and rest without being restricted.

Having the drawers for all of Safiya's medical equipment would be very helpful as it means it is accessible when needed.

The cot will help improve Sam's physical health and enable him to spend more time together with his family and feel less isolated.



Obtaining this specialist bed would grant us the opportunity to reclaim our bedroom space and rest peacefully, as we are currently sharing a room to provide constant care and support to Ohad throughout the night.

The lack of sleep they are receiving has a negative impact, particularly affecting our support for Ohad's three other siblings as well. The specialist bed would allow the whole family to sleep more peacefully.

We also provided a medical cot for Sam, aged 18 months old.

Sam has a lovely smile and he tries to smile through all his hardships.

Sam experiences oesophageal atresia, which is a rare condition where a short section - at the top of the oesophagus - has not formed properly, so is not connected to the stomach.

This means food cannot pass from the throat to the stomach.

Shia is currently using a small cot which he has outgrown. Shia has had multiple hospital visits in the last few months for different types of surgeries.

Fundraising at Variety

Over the last 12 months, Variety has made fantastic headway towards re-building our national fundraising activities and meeting our target for ambitious growth.

As of November, we're on track to achieving our yearly target of £4.7m from direct donations, with income of £4.6m. This reflects a big step forward towards hitting our latest, pre-pandemic fundraising peak of £5.38m in 2019.

Variety has proved itself a resilient charity. With a brand new CEO and strategy, we've grown our fundraising income by over half since the pandemic. Variety's vibrant suite of successful events continue to expand, and so is our philanthropic income stream.

For the first time in several years, we're now in a firm position to expand and strategically lead the team.

Dazzling nights of achievement

Team Variety is delighted to report another hugely successful past six months - with an accolade of impactful fundraisers nationally.

This includes an incredibly fruitful period, following our work with our Chief Barker, for the Michael Josephson MBE Ball; PROPS North West and, our Legends of Industry Awards.

With £1,290,900 secured since January, we've exceeded our original target by c. £100,000.



Hosted by Variety, the Children's Charity, these awards evening celebrated and championed the achievements of disabled sportspeople, from emerging talents to outstanding individuals and teams.

Comedian and presenter, Adam Hills MBE, hosted the awards and was joined by inspiring sportspeople and celebrities. These included one of Britain's most decorated Paralympians, Tanni, Baroness Grey-Thompson.

We were delighted to present awards to this year's recipients, ready for broadcasted release by Channel 4.

An overwhelming success, an international audience of 300 people joined on the night.





Launch of our Voices for Change campaign

In November, we launched our Voices for Change campaign at the VDSA.

Variety's Voices for Change is a grassroots advocacy campaign aimed at breaking down barriers that prevent disabled children from low-income families from accessing sports and physical activities.

We surveyed 130 children and young people supported by Variety.

Key findings include:

- 77% of families & young people surveyed rated disability sports equipment as "very difficult" to afford
- £5,500 is the median cost of adaptive sports wheelchairs. This is prohibitively high
- 85% reported increased independence

Highlights from Leadership

We end this year with Variety being excellently positioned to protect its services and long-term viability.

By the end of November, we've raised an incredible £5.9m, from all types of income generation.

£4.6m of this was raised from directly charitable donations, separately from events, and puts us on target to meet our ambitious aim of £4.7m.

This reflects growth of 20% on pandemic levels of income and a 10% growth, post-pandemic.

We're able to expand whilst protecting a healthy level of reserves.

Our ambition is to now sustainably expand our grants by a further 5% on last year - with £3.9m provided to November.

Looking to 2025, we're hoping to grow our wider charity income by 15%.

This shows how we're protecting and nurturing funding relationships that we've built over the last year.

Given the cost-of-living crisis and scarcity of funding, this is crucial news.

Such year-on-year growth is a testament to our highly lean and efficient fundraising team.



- 3. Social connections and life skills. Offering gateways to the community that broaden horizons, offer role models & redress inequality.
